

#### TWO LITTLE REMINDERS

As mentioned at Mass last weekend, parking is sometimes an issue – and not because of a lack of spaces. Below are a couple of reminders concerning you, the parishioners, some who may not realize that several of the closest spots to the church are often unused... Also, with Christmas around the corner, it is a good time to remind all parishioners to be

welcoming to those who may need a seat.

**<u>1. PARKING</u>**: There are four parking lots available for use at our church: Two in front, on the corner of Stephenson Street and Church Street, and two behind, on Dickson Street. The lots, along with the street parking available along our parish property, provide 98 parking spaces...without blocking driveways, lot exits, or hydrants.

~~Please remember the following:

- Please avoid blocking the driveways of our neighbors, or the garage at the Pastor's house (*former convent*) Please Do Not Block Lot entrances or exits, or park across crosswalks or on yellow lines.
- Enter the Stephenson Street lots from Church Street, and exit onto Stephenson Street
- Enter the Dickson Street Lots (*those behind the school and church*) from Dickson Street and exit using the ally behind the church and school.

The Dickson Street lot behind the church is not yet paved, but is graded, and ready for use, and is the closest lot to the back entrance and ramp into the church.

**2. SEATING:** Our Blessed Lord calls each of us to welcome the stranger, and to receive little children. These are not ambiguous words from Sacred Scripture, they are a direct instruction from Christ to each of us. To the best of anyone's knowledge, assigned seats are not given to parishioners. Although concerns of sitting too close to someone who may be sick, wearing too much perfume or cologne, etc., can certainly be understood, refusing to slide down and allow people in when the church is full, or even making people walk around and enter from another aisle rather than standing to allow them into a pew can seem rude and unwelcoming.

~~*Please remember*: we share our Church building with each other – and were brought up to be ladies and gentlemen – placing the needs of others before our own...please be courteous and accommodating to each other in the pews. Also, be aware when putting on perfume and cologne, it is winter and there is not as much fresh air moving through the building – a little bit goes a long way.

And keep in mind, the stranger looking for a seat may be someone returning to church and to the sacraments after months or years away. It is the responsibility of each and every parishioner to bring others to Christ. Sometimes all it takes is a smile and kind gesture.
