

COORDINATING TEAMS

To implement the Five Year Plan, the Parish Pastoral Council has established four coordinating teams. Each team will be responsible for one of the areas of ministry that the Diocese of Scranton sees as integral to the life of the parish: Word, Worship, Community and Service. The focus of each area is:

WORD: Evangelization and lifelong faith formation. WORSHIP: Liturgy, devotional practices, prayer, training. COMMUNITY: Communication and public relations. SERVICE: Making justice and mercy lived values in society.

The teams have had a general formation session and an individual formation session. Each has been given a "charter" from the Pastoral Council that delineates our mission and values, and entrusts the goals to them to be implemented. The charter also establishes the relationship between the team and the Pastoral Council and the parish.

The teams will now meet to form an action plan and timeline to implement the goals and objectives they have been given.
