

Questions for personal reflection based on this Sunday's readings...

 ${f A}$ s they were proceeding on their journey someone said to [Jesus],

"I will follow you wherever you go."

Jesus answered him, "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests,

but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head." And to another he said, "Follow me." But he replied, "Lord, let me go first and bury my father."

But he answered him, "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God."

And another said, "I will follow you, Lord,

but first let me say farewell to my family at home."

To him Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."

-Luke 9:59-62

To bury the dead is a holy thing. Not only does it show respect for those who have died, but also a respect and proper dignity for Human Life, and for the body which God had created and sustained, and which will be raised on the last day. So, then, what is Jesus getting at here? This passage is about commitment to Jesus, not a rebuke of funerals. Our blessed Lord calls each of us to total devotion to God above all else.

Am I committed to God in service and Christian witness? What do I put ahead of service to others? At a funeral, do I spend my energy looking back, mourning over my own memories of what was, or do I use those beautiful memories as a foundation to keep looking ahead, praying for the deceased soul's safe arrival in our heavenly homeland?
