Mother's Day

An Easter Reflection -

Like a Mother Hen

Sending forth a child has to be one of the hardest things that a parent must do. This is especially true for a mother. Whether it be to pre-school or a university, whether it be into a life-long commitment or a week at a summer camp, there is always some fear about letting go. A mother-child relationship whose nourishing begins in a womb, touches upon the same significant bond that Jesus longs for us with the Holy Father in this Sunday's Gospel.

John's Gospel this Sunday is a portion of what is often called Jesus' "high priestly prayer." In this prayer Jesus consecrates his own body and blood in preparation to his sacrificing his life for all of us. This consecration is Jesus' blessing of that unique significance of his life as God's Word made flesh and his deep love in God which he gives to his disciples. Like a mother, he carries his disciples in the womb of faithfulness and intimate love.

Jesus shares the same fears that anyone in the role of a mother has in their hearts. There is no possibility of taking a disciple, or a child, out of the world. What Jesus wants for all of his "little children" is to know that he too belongs to the world in which we all are a part, and that he will always protect us from the "evil one," no matter what form that evil may take.

The strengths that a mother, or a disciple, discovers is grounded in a deep truth that we discover in our "mothering." Our call is to send people into the world who have remained in God's love, even as darkness attempted to overpower the brightness of love which we seek to shine all through the world. This is the real strength of every other, to choose to love in every situation, even when it involves willing sacrifice, unyielding commitment and fearless challenge.

As we all know, motherhood is not for the faint of heart. At another time in the gospels, Jesus invokes another image of what being a mother is all about (Luke 13:34). He speaks of his desire "to gather your children together just as a hen gathers her young under her wings." Whenever a danger would strike a mother hen, for example a fire, she gathered all her brood under her wings seeking to protect them and willing to sacrifice her own life. This is how Jesus guards his flock.

A mother teaches her children with great intensity and powerful example. Her love for one another as God loves, embodies her commitment to love no matter what the situation. Here is the ministry we are all called to if we choose to be Jesus' disciples. This is what we honor in all our mothers this day - their choosing to love even as the fires of doubt and fear fall down from the sky, their remaining in God's love now and forever. -Fr. Michael
