## Cultivators of Peace

St. James, in our second reading this Sunday, challenges us to “cultivate peace,” in order that we might be able to bring justice into our too often selfish world. But how does one cultivate peace? How do we remain patient, and approach the jealousy and selfish ambition inside us and around us in a gentle way? How do we receive into our lives those we know need our help, those seen in our society as least or lowly, without allowing our fears of not being safe overwhelm us?

The suggestion from our present culture’s atmosphere is that in order to survive, be in charge, or have control of the situation, one must be great and powerful. Even Jesus’ disciples have embraced this idea, as they argue among one another who is the greatest. Jesus clarifies what is important, after his probing question moves them to silence. To follow Jesus means we have to not be threatened by being “last of all and servant of all.” Our weakness and innocence is exactly the type of helping fertilization Jesus needs to transform the world.

The threats that we face around us, from the intimacy and privacy of our personal and family lives, all the way through to almost every worldly event, are based on reality. There is not much happening in our time that we aren’t able to research and see either good outcomes or evil cravings. There is so much that we know, and yet, we hope there is much more to discover about the One who sent Jesus to carry our crosses and die for our passions. We may throw up our arms in disbelief about many things, yet the “wisdom from above,” has much more to teach us.

How can we be sure of this, that our learnings have only begun to sustain our lives? St. James again points to the disorders of our beloved lives and our world. Where is the purity of our intentions and the peace in our endeavors? Where is our gentleness toward one another and our compliancy with God? Are we full of mercy and goodness, or is there an inconstancy and insincerity in our response to other’s failures, sins and shame?

Jesus does not add to the silent shame of his disciples. But he does call the Twelve, and ourselves, to not be concerned about being first. Rather, he puts his arms around all our inadequacies and breakdowns, all our coveting toward others’ possessions and fighting waged toward our imagined foes. Jesus receives us as the children we actually are. He desires to answer all our questions, not with the intelligence or judgement of the world; but by inviting us to enter into the house of the One who sows peace. God plants this peace into all of our actions and bids us become true cultivators of Christ’s peace with another everyday of our lives.

Our Parish's annual Day of Solemn Eucharistic Adoration here at Nativity of Our Lord is set for Monday, October 7<sup>th</sup>, the Feast of Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary, Patroness of our church building.

The Eucharist will be exposed after the 7:00 a.m. Mass until Evening Prayer and Benediction at 7:00 p.m. Sign-up sheets are in the church vestibule. Our Guest Speaker for Evening Prayer this year will be Father Ryan Glenn, pastor of Christ the King Parish, Archbald.

Someone must be at prayer in the church at all times during exposition, and all members of societies and ministers are expected to make every effort to spend some time with Our Lord in prayer and adoration on this day.
