A Reflection on Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

he Faithful Witness


As we think over Jesus as Christ the King, with the Gospel of John as our resource for this Sunday's feast, we must be careful to not "lump together" every Jewish person when St. John speaks of "the Jews." Most times he is speaking of the role the Jewish authorities, people like Caiaphas, the chief priests and some of the scribes and Pharisees, had in Jesus' crucifixion. Indeed, many of the disciples of Jesus who were deeply connected to his message and who believed him to be the Son of God, also initially held tightly to their Jewish roots.

These early disciples broadened their understanding of Jesus over time. Indeed, one of the tenets of their faith to be expanded was this notion of the King. Their dreams of the coming of the Messiah were grounded in their learnings about King David, and yearnings for, in the Hebrew scriptures – a mighty warrior who would set them free, especially from the Roman conquests.

Truly, Christ the King is mighty; but Jesus' predominant gospel message spoke of mercy and peace. As the Book of Revelation tells us this Sunday, he is the faithful witness to this, who "loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood." Our King is more centered on sacrifice than he is on war or violence.

This is "the truth" that the Jews and Pilate are not able to grasp. Possibly it is the same truth which we sometimes battle with as we seek to live as faithful witnesses. Like the Prophet Daniel in the first reading, we too have "visions in the night" and the day, that somehow the King comes and sets free the chaos of our world. We long for the Ancient One to touch our modern times and end the disunity which divides us. We search for a kingdom which initially stops the bad-mouthing we inflict on one another, and then opens doors to a deeper, loving acceptance of "all peoples, nations and languages."

Pilate's inquisitive bantering with Jesus in the Praetorium in John's Gospel, is more about himself, and us, then it is about Jesus. Jesus' confidence and fidelity to "my kingdom is not here" and "the truth" is extremely evident to Jesus. His voice comes from a greater Truth and "it shall not be taken away." If only we could find this same strength, this same oneness with the King.



There is a concluding verse of this piece of John's Gospel not quoted in our reading. Pilate in response to Jesus' statement, "Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice," makes this inquiry, "What is truth?" He then goes out to the authorities and tells them, "I find no guilt in him." It seems he is attempting to hold on to the truth about who Jesus is, but often like ourselves he capitulates to both the authorities and the crowds.

On this feast of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, may we take hold of the Truth more profoundly in our living. May we treat with a holiness, everyone's relationship with the King – a relationship that is not in the clouds, but rather one in which the kingdom of Jesus is real now. In our standing with Jesus and listening to his voice of compassion and reconciliation towards everyone, may we truly become faithful witnesses. -Fr. Michael
